What Does The Bible Teach About Marriage, Divorce, and Remarriage?

- The Bible teaches that it was our God who instituted the marriage bond, not man, and that God designed marriage to be a union between one man, and one woman. (Genesis 2:18, 21-25; Matthew 19:4-6; Romans 1:22-32)
- The Bible teaches that the marriage bond is to be a loving and respectful union on the behalf of both the husband and the wife, and that marriage is to be honored by all. (Ephesians 5:22-33; Titus 2:4-5; 1 Peter 3:1-7; Hebrews 13:4)
- The Bible teaches the permanence of the marriage bond, and it also teaches that only adultery or the death of a spouse/mate can dissolve the marriage bond. (Malachi 2:16; Matthew 19:5-9; Romans 7:2-3; 1 Cor. 7:10-11, 39)

What Does The Bible Teach About Marriage, Divorce, and Remarriage?

- The Bible teaches that a lawful divorce takes place when the innocent spouse puts away the spouse guilty of fornication, and then it teaches that the innocent party, and only the innocent party can lawfully remarry without committing adultery. (Matthew 5:32, 19:9; Romans 7:3)
- The Bible teaches that those who are guilty fornicators, adulterers, and homosexuals, will not inherit the kingdom of God. Therefore, be one who takes heed to what God has said about marriage, divorce, and remarriage. For failure to do so, will cost you your soul.
 (1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Galatians 5:19-21; Hebrews 13:4)
