

What Does The Bible Teach About Baptism?

- The Bible teaches that baptism is a command, given by the authority of the Lord Jesus Christ.
 (Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 10:48)
- The Bible teaches that the proper mode of baptism is a burial, an immersion in water.

(Romans 6:3-4; Colossians 2:11-12; Acts 8:36-39)

- The Bible teaches that there is only one baptism.
 (Ephesians 4:5)
- The Bible teaches that baptism is for the remission of sins. It is for the removal or putting off of sins. (Acts 2:38, 22:16; Colossians 2:11-12)

What Does The Bible Teach About Baptism?

- The Bible teaches that baptism places one in Christ. (Romans 6:3-4; Galatians 3:27)
- The Bible teaches that baptism adds one to the one body (i.e. church), the Lord's church.

(Acts 2:47; 1 Corinthians 12:13)

- The Bible teaches that baptism is needed to make disciples of the Lord. (Matthew 28:18-20)
- The Bible teaches that baptism is essential for one's salvation. (Mark 16:16; 1 Peter 3:21)

What Does The Bible Teach About Baptism?

- The Bible teaches us about who should be baptized.
 (Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38, 8:36-38)
- The Bible teaches the urgency of baptism, once one fully understands the conditions and the necessity of baptism. (Acts 16:30-33, 22:16)

What Must I Do To Be Saved?

- Hear the word of God. (Romans 10:17)
- Believe in Jesus Christ. (John 8:24)
- Repent of your sins. (Acts 17:30)
- Confess Jesus Christ. (Matthew 10:32)
- Be baptized for the remission of sins. (Acts 2:38)
- Remain faithful unto death. (Revelation 2:10)
