- When defined "unity" is "the state of being one" or "the state of being united as a whole."
- In the book of Acts we are given a great example of the church being a unified church. (Acts 2:41-47)

Why Is Unity In The Church Important?

- Our Lord desires for all believers to be united as one. (John 17:20-23)
- Christians are instructed to be united as one, and for there to be no divisions among them. (1 Cor. 1:10-13; Eph. 4:1-3; Phil. 1:27; 1 Pet. 3:8)
- In unity there is strength, and a strong church will be a unified church. (Matthew 12:25)
- God disapproves of those who sow discord among brethren. (Proverbs 6:19)
- It is good and pleasant for brethren to dwell together in unity. (Psalm 133:1)

How Can Unity Be Effectively Obtained and Maintained In The Church?

- Unity must be diligently sought after by each and every member of the church in order for it to be obtained and maintained. (Eph. 4:3; Rom. 14:19)
- The proper character as the elect of God must be exemplified by each and every member of the church. (Colossians 3:12-15)
- Every member of the church must put away their pride. (Proverbs 13:10)
- Every member of the church must lay aside their anger. (Proverbs 29:22)

How Can Unity Be Effectively Obtained and Maintained In The Church?

- Every member of the church must cease to gossip. (Proverbs 26:20)
- Unselfishness is going to be required of every member of the church. (Philippians 2:1-4)
- Every member of the church must walk by the same rule. (Philippians 3:16)
- Pray for unity to be obtained and maintained in the church. (James 5:16)
