We Learn The Need To Beware of Covetousness. (Luke 12:15)

- “Covetous” is defined as “a strong or eager desire for wealth and possessions.”
- Our conduct is to be without covetousness. (Hebrews 13:5)

Valuable Lessons From The Parable of The Rich Fool

We Learn That True Security Is Not In Material Wealth and Possessions. (Luke 12:16-21)

- **One's possessions will be left behind to those who come after them. (Ecclesiastes 2:18)**
- **Remember, we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. (1 Timothy 6:17-19)**

Valuable Lessons From The Parable of The Rich Fool

We Learn The Need To Trust In God and Not In Uncertain Riches. (Luke 12:18-21)

- **One who is not rich toward God is a fool. (Luke 12:20-21)**
- **Do not trust in uncertain riches, but trust in the one true living God. (1 Timothy 6:17-19)**

We Learn The Fact That Our Soul Will Someday Be Required of Us. (Luke 12:20)

- **The man's soul was required of him that night. (Luke 12:20)**
- **Would you be ready if your soul was required of you this very night? (Hebrews 9:27-28)**

What Must I Do To Be Saved?

- Hear the word of God and keep it. (Luke 11:28)
- Believe in Jesus Christ. (John 8:24)
- Repent of your sins. (Luke 13:3, 5)
- Confess Jesus Christ. (Matthew 10:32)
- Be baptized for the remission of sins. (Mark 16:16)
- Remain faithful unto death. (Revelation 2:10)
