

The Origin of Observance

How did this practice originate?

- Jesus Christ instituted the observance of the Lord's Supper.(Matthew 26:26-29; Mark 14:22-29; Luke 22:19-20)
- The Lord's Supper was instituted on the evening that Jesus and His disciples sat down to eat the Passover. (Matthew 26:17-21; Mark 14:12-18; Luke 22:7-8)
- Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper on the same night that He was betrayed. (1 Corinthians 11:23)

The Emblems of Observance

- Unleavened bread. (Matthew 26:26, 26:17; Deut. 16:1-4)
 - 1. Unleavened bread is bread made without yeast.
 - 2. This represents the body of Jesus. (Matthew 26:26)
- The fruit of the vine. (Matthew 26:27-29)
 - 1. The "fruit" of the "vine" denotes that which is produced on the vine (i.e. the grape).
 - 2. This represents the blood of Jesus. (Matthew 26:28)

The Day, Frequency, and Proper Place of Observance

- The Lord's Supper is to be observed on the first day of the week. (Acts 20:7)
- We learn how often to partake of the Lord's Supper through necessary inference.
 - 1. The example for the day of observance of the Lord's Supper has been given to us. (Acts 20:7)
 - 2. Which "first" day? Since none is specified we must necessarily conclude that it is to be observed every first day of the week.
- The Lord's Supper is to be observed in the place where the saints come together as the church. (1 Corinthians 11:18, 20)
- The proper place of observance of the Lord's Supper belongs in the coming together of the Lord's disciples on the first day of the week. (Acts 20:7)

The Manner of Observance

- We must all observe the Lord's Supper in a worthy manner. (1 Corinthians 11:27-29)
- The correct manner of observance will involve selfexamination. (1 Corinthians 11:28)

The Purpose of Observance

- It is to be done in remembrance of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
- It's designed as a means to proclaim the Lord's death till He comes. (1 Corinthians 11:26)

What Must I Do To Be Saved?

- Hear the word of God. (Romans 10:17)
- Believe in Jesus Christ. (John 8:24)
- Repent of your sins. (Acts 17:30)
- Confess Jesus Christ. (Matthew 10:32)
- Be baptized into Christ for the remission of your sins. (Acts 2:38; Galatians 3:27-29)
- Remain faithful unto death. (Revelation 2:10)
